The first part of the document deals with a messuage with a barn, outhouses, buildings, yard, garden and ground covering 3 acres (not Street Farmhouse). It is in the occupation of **Thomas Kebble, John Hewitt, William Hollands** and **John Sidders**. It had been bought by John Friend from John Goodbourn and John Stringer.

The next section of the document deals with the sale of 'Rose Cottages', as Street Farmhouse was called at this time. It included 'the messuage or tenement now divided into three dwellings, with barn, stable buildings, yard and garden and one piece or parcel of land adjoining, 2 acres in the place called Church Hill'. It had previously been in the tenure of:

**Christopher Coulver**,

**Thomas Darby** (and now Darby's widow)

**Turner Gisby** 

William Hollands (now occupied by Chapman and William Hollands)

The house and land was to be sold for £800, but the buyer could only find £600, so the Guarantor was to stand surety for the other £200. This was how the sale finally went through.

There is also a date of 5th and 6th June 1793, concerning pieces of land in the occupation of:

John Friend purchased this land in 1810 from John Strevous and William Strevous
