POPULATION IN BIRCHINGTON – 1914

There were 2,522 people in Birchington in 1914

Out of these, 474 men joined up

69 of the men were killed

There were also a number of women who joined nursing corps and moved away from the village during the war – either to London or to various units in France.

When the village was asked to find the funds to make two aircraft at £5,000 the pair, 23rd May 1918, there were only about 2000 people here, but despite these small numbers, they managed to raise £13,600 over the three day event!

A more detailed look at this event reveals something more.

Looking at the phenomenal amount brought in by the children on the Thursday – over £2,500 – it would seem reasonable to surmise that there had been some <u>very</u> concentrated and committed fundraising going on prior to that weekend. This would have applied as well to ladies on the Friday - £7,558 by the Saturday morning – and by the end of the men's fund raising donations at the end of Saturday, they had all raised £10,023. The amount finally handed over, though, was £13,600 a totally amazing effort for that community of just over 2000 people (including children).
