1919 R. J. Peake occupied 'The Grey Bungalow' - lived there till about 1928
1928 Power of Attorney was granted to Mrs Ada Peake
1930 'The Grey Bungalow' was occupied by Mrs Dorothy Hunter
1951 The occupant is shown as Major E.L. Hunter, M.C. (retd.)
1960 Frank Jackson bought the bungalow and then made it into two dwellings.
1967 'The Gray Bungalow was sold to George A. Whyte.
Soon after this, it was renamed 'Deesacre'
