

JOHN QUEK, with his son **Richard** by his side, wears civilian dress with his anelace hanging from his girdle. The son beside him, dressed as a replica of his father, did not die until ten years later. The brass is on the north wall of Quex Chapel. The inscription translates:

"Here lies John Quek who died 21st day of October A.D. 1449

The missing text (Pray for the soul of ...) was defaced during the Reformation as it was deemed 'popish'.
