There was also a crop of daffodil bulbs in flower, which were to be sold.

This list was dated 17th Feb 1926

After the sale, the amount raised for this section was £111 / 9s / 5d, but a quantity of cauliflowers (not in the original list) were still waiting to be disposed of.

The sale also included some cattle, but the list was still to be finalised and is not included in the documents in this set. It appears that the list was sent to Charles Petley & Co, the auctioneers, but not kept with the other documents. In 1924 there were chicken kept in the rear meadow of the farm, as a photo of that date shows. The photo is under Court Mount in Birchington Heritage Museum.

Mr W H Evans of Queensdown Farm near Westgate wrote and asked if he could send a 4-wheeled rubber-tyred trap (or Phaeton) to be included in the sale. Whether this was accepted is not recorded. A Phaeton was a 4-wheeled vehicle with open sides for transporting parcels, people or other packaged or container goods.
