REGARDING THE FAMILY OF FREEMAN EVERALL

Child mentioned in Park Lane School Log Books

Freeman Everall was mentioned in the School records of Birchington C of E National School on the 9th November 1863, when he and others who lived at the St. Nicholas Coastguard Station "left for the winter, the way being too dangerous."

Two years before, in the Census of 1861, Freeman appeared with his family, living at the Coast Guard Station:-

All had moved to Kessingland, Suffolk by 1871.

In 1881, Freeman was an Able Seaman aboard HMS Cormorant (a Composite Sloop) at Farm Cove, Port Jackson, Sydney, New South Wales.

Some time after 1881 Freeman joined the Coastguard service. He appears to have served in Ireland for a period of at least 12 years.

In the Census of 1911 we find him back in Hythe, Kent, living at the Coast Guard Station with his wife and family:-

There appears to have been an older son, Edward H Everall who, in 1911 was an Able Seaman aboard the training ship Leviathan in Chatham Dockyard. He was then aged 22, so born circa 1889, in Annalong, Co. Down, his mother's birthplace.
