Nevill Maurice Granville Sharp, Vicar of Birchington between 1935 - 1953. Kathleen Mary Granville Sharp died at Orsino on 23rd Dec 1952 aged 79 The Rev. W. C. Granville Sharp gifted "Orsino" to another of his sons, Norman Herbert Granville Sharp, in 1953. By then, he himself was living in a flat at "White Gates", 43 Alpha Road, Birchington, although he continued to be listed under "Orsino".
