The Above at Birchington aforesaid."

"The following at Eastry in Kent, all in his own tenure, Wind Seed Mill only [no kiln therein] not exceeding One Hundred & Eighty pounds, Standing & going Gears with Machines & Dressing Mills therein only not exceeding Seventy pounds, Storehouse only near timber & tiled, not exceeding Fifteen pounds, Stock & Utensils therein only not exceeding Fifteen pounds, House & Storehouse adjoining near, Brick & tiled, not exceeding One Hundred pounds, Stock & Utensils therein only not exceeding Fifteen pounds."

"N.B. Free from Loss on such Hay or Corn as shall be destroyed or damaged by Natural Heat."
