\*\* Clarrie Pemble was the younger brother of Ashton Pemble who wrote the 'Russian' Diary, published by our Museum. He died in August 1918, so near the end of the war. Ashton writes of it in his diary.

\*\*\* Sgt. Wright was the fiancé of Kittie Wells from North Lodge, Quex Park. On the first anniversary of his death, she committed suicide. See Churchyard notes for the full story

There are 69 names on the War Memorial for WW 1, although Col THOMAS Joseph KEARNS died from his wounds in 1920, just too late to be added to the names on the memorial. He is commemorated through the Church of St Thomas at Minnis Bay, of which his widow, Haidee Kearns, was a most generous benefactor. She was even permitted to choose which saint the church would be dedicated to.
