

Gas Standards



The bases of the old gas lamp standards, which were installed in the church by Frank Honeyball in memory of his mother in 1904, were stood within wooden shafts at intervals around the church. The standards were removed in 1935, when electric lights replaced them. The holes left by the removal of the gas pipes were filled with large pieces of dowel the thickness of broom handles, still seen in various pews today.
